Since its creation in 2020, your country signed on to the Geneva Consensus Declaration, a joint initiative led by six countries including the United States, Brazil, Egypt, Hungary, Indonesia, and Uganda, promoting the strengthening and optimal health of women and the family. In 2020, the United States was the lead sponsor of the Declaration.

The Trump Administration has stated its commitment to promoting women's health and the preservation of the family values that the international coalition as a whole, and its individual member states, support through national policy and legislation. Accordingly, the United States hereby rejoins the Geneva Consensus Declaration.
